

Vocational Education & Training (VET)

Cardijn College is committed to ensuring that our graduates have a diversity of skills for a dynamic and ever-changing world. We support all of our students to undertake vocational training as part of their learning journey.

Nationally accredited qualifications in Vocational Education and Training (VET) open up a myriad of employment and study opportunities. Students can utilise VET for direct employment pathways or use completed qualifications to gain access to further tertiary studies.

Vocational Education and Training is recognised as a valued component of the South Australian Certificate of Education. The majority of completed Certificate III qualifications, can be counted as university entrance subjects in the calculations of a student's Australian Tertiary Admissions Ranking (ATAR). Increasingly, universities see a diversity of student skills as an advantage to their prospective graduates; with some universities accepting completed VET as a pathway into varying courses. Qualifications are completed within one year and students train on-site at our campuses and in some cases, at off-site locations.

In addition to qualifications delivered by the College's RTO - MTC Training, Cardijn College also supports students undertaking external vocational training available to secondary school students provided by Registered Training Organisations.

Students in Years 11 and 12 may be eligible for funding through VETRO. Please see details on Page 15 for more information.

Families may have to pay fees and will be required to make their own transport arrangements for these courses if the training is held off-site.

Students wishing to undertake a non ATAR pathway MUST contact the Pathways Hub, as there are limited university courses open to this pathway.

The courses that are available require specific subjects, which vary from course to course. Students MUST have a discussion with the VET Coordinator prior to choosing this pathway.



CERTIFICATE II SALON ASSISTANT SHB20216 (RTO 0186)

The qualification prepares students to provide assistance to hairdressers in a salon environment. Course units include elements of styling, basin services, applying colour and completing in-store operational, and sales duties.

Upon successful completion, VET graduates will receive a nationally recognised qualification that can be used to seek employment.

CERTIFICATE II RETAIL COSMETICS SHB20121 (RTO 0186)

This qualification prepares students to sell, demonstrate and apply products in a retail cosmetic environment - such as a salon, makeup studio or department store. Course units include elements of makeup design and application, specialty techniques and instore operational duties.

Upon completion, students can enter apprenticeships and become a Beautician, Make-Up Artist, Nail Technician or Beauty Therapist.

CERTIFICATE III MAKEUP SHB30221 (RTO 2316)

During this program participants will gain the necessary skills and confidence to work as a Freelance Makeup Artist, providing Makeup, Airbrush Makeup and Hairstyling Services to clients.

Job outcomes include working for clients such as Photography Studios, Bridal and Personal Services, Spa and Salons, Fashion Industry including Runways, Photo shoots and events.

Work placement is provided in the Media Makeup Retail Store and Student Salon located at the Academy. This provides a hands-on experience to best develop the communication and practical skills required to work in Retail Cosmetics and Freelance Artists. This course includes a series of Professional Photo Shoot to develop a Professional Portfolio.

This program is combination of Makeup & Beauty, designed to teach a variety of services required for a home salon or to work in a hairdressing/beauty salon or spa. There's a strong focus on Makeup, covering the fundamentals to provide event makeup services like Photographic & Bridal Makeup. This course includes a Professional Photoshoot.

Adding Beauty services that complement Makeup is a great way to maximize and diversify your income as most beauty services are needed year-round, so can fill up appointments during the week and build clientele. During the program you will learn Lash Extensions, Lash and Brow Tinting, Brow Shaping, Waxing Services, Spray Tanning and Manicure & Pedicure Services.

CERTIFICATE III INDIVIDUAL SUPPORT CHC33021 (RTO 31736)

Students can enter this course at Years 11 or 12 only. There is a family co-contribution cost associated with enrolment in this course.

Once completed, this entrylevel qualification, allows working as; Aged Care Worker, Personal Care Giver, Residential Support Worker or Respite Care Worker. Further training can lead to careers in Diversional Therapy, Disability Services Management and nursing pathways. Employment growth in this sector is very strong.

This completed qualification can count as a Year 12 subject in ATAR calculations.

This qualification may give you the skills and training to understand the important role of workers in the community and/or residential setting. These workers follow an individualised plan to provide person-centered support to people who may require support due to aging, disability, or some other reason.

Completion of this course requires a vocational placement of 120 hours.

Further training can lead to careers in Diversional Therapy, Disability Services Management and nursing pathways. Employment growth in this sector is very strong.

This completed qualification can count as a Year 12 subject in ATAR calculations.

CERTIFICATE III EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION AND CARE CHC30121 (RTO31736)

This course is the entry-level qualification to become a Childhood Education Assistant, Out of School Hours Care Worker or Preschool Assistant.

This course requires 160 hours of placement to complete the course.

This completed qualification can count as a Year 12 subject in ATAR calculations.

To work in child care you must have, or be actively working towards, at least have a Certificate III qualification. This qualification reflects the role of workers in a range of early childhood education settings that work within the requirements of the Education and Care Services National Regulations and the National Quality Standard.

Direct employment opportunities include; General Clerks, Payroll Officers and Data Entry Operators. This qualification is a great lead-in to the Certificate IV in New Small Business and the realisation of a career as a Small Business Owner.

This completed qualification can count as a Year 12 subject in ATAR calculations.

In this qualification, you may gain the fundamental business skills and knowledge to successfully perform a wide range of duties in a business setting across diverse industries.

During this course you will have the opportunity to learn a variety of different skills that can be applied to a robust range of industries. You will learn how to use social media platforms to elevate your Business, as well as understand the needs of your customers and work effectively with a team.

The skills can be implemented to obtain employment opportunities in a range of different industries, or give you some valuable tools to manage a team.

CERTIFICATE III SCREEN AND MEDIA CUA31020 (RTO 88021)

The Game Art Foundations course will teach students how to develop 3D environments, characters and animation for interactive games. Game art development is an exciting and dynamic entertainment medium that is quickly being adapted into traditional areas such as architecture, product design and film making as well as emerging technologies such as VR and AR.

The course covers the techniques of making 3D artwork for games including:

- Concept art
- 3D modeling
- Texturing
- Animation
- Lighting
- Gray boxing
- Creating animated game characters
- Creating interactive environments
- Adding audio
- Interactive game play elements

The Game Art Foundations course teaches students best practice for a creative and iterative pipeline with the importance on developing quality 3D artwork for games. Students will work with real-time game engines to showcase their creativity and build their technical knowledge in order to maximise their artwork within fun and engaging game environments.

CERTIFICATE III INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY ICT30120 (RTO 88021)

The Game Development Foundations course will allow you to create 3D games using the powerful Unity 3D game engine. Students will be introduced to industry standard tools and techniques for game development. The course covers:

- Use C# to develop games in Unity 3D
- Learn about game mechanics and how to implement them
- Create games faster as you learn rapid prototyping
- Explore Unity3D's components and scripting to generate levels, special effects, user interface and game logic
- Import artwork assets for games
- Manage projects using version control and collaboration tools
- Successful completion awarded with Certificate III in Information Technology

During the course you will develop two games and a web page to display them; the first game introduces you to development in Unity3D. The final production allows you, in small teams or individually, to create the concept, manage the scope, integrate art assets and test a game.

What is VETRO?

VET Readiness Orientation (VETRO) is both evidence of student preparation to undertake a VET course and an online assessment that sets benchmarks for the Literacy and Numeracy skills considered essential for student success in the Flexible Industry Pathways (FIPs).

To be eligible for access to a subsidised training place, a school student must meet the following criteria.

They must be:

- An Australian or New Zealand citizen or,
- A permanent Australian resident or,
- An eligible visa holder
- Reside in South Australia

They must also be:

• enrolled in Year 11, 12 or 13 and be 16 years of age or turning 16 years of age in the current year of that enrolment, and

• undertaking SACE or equivalent

CERTIFICATE III MUSIC (SOUND PRODUCTION) CUA30920 (RTO 41549)

The Certificate III in Music assists students in developing a wide range of competencies in varied work contexts of the music industry, as well as in environments that require skills in music performance, music creation or composition, sound production or music business.

The qualification is suited to students with a broad interest in music who are keen to further develop skills in their area of interest, from preparing for performances, recording, and mixing music or repairing and maintaining audio equipment for live music events. Career and pathways opportunities may lead to roles such as studio assistant, performer or session musician, producer, arranger, stagehand, broadcaster and sound & lighting technician. Upon completion, this entrylevel qualification, allows entry into careers in; Assistant Music Management, Assistant Sound Mixing and Musical Performance. With further training, students can pursue careers in; Sound Engineering, Music Arrangement, Musical Composition, Sound Mixing and Music Management.

CERTIFICATE II CONSTRUCTION PATHWAYS CPC20220 (RTO 40354)

This pre-apprenticeship course provides students with the basic operational knowledge and the development of skills applicable to a broad variety of trades within the building and construction industry. The course involves both theory and practical skills in building and construction, with an emphasis on carpentry.

These apprenticeships can be either school-based, while a student completes their SACE, or full time at Marcellin Campus.

This qualification provides a pathway to the primary trades in the construction industry with the exception of plumbing.

Trade outcomes are predominantly achieved through an Australian Apprenticeship and this qualification allows for inclusion of skills suited for entry to off-site occupations, such as joinery as well as carpentry, bricklaying and other occupations in general construction.

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CERTIFICATE II ELECTROTECHNOLOGY (CAREER START) UEE22020 (RTO 40354)

The Certificate II in Electrotechnology (Career Start) is a pre-apprenticeship course and is the first step to gaining an apprenticeship in the Electrotechnology Industry. This qualification covers competencies in electrical safety as well as basic skills and knowledge for work in any Electrotechnology discipline. Electricians install, maintain, repair, test and commission electrical and electronic equipment and systems for industrial, commercial and domestic purposes. Electricians may also work on electrical transmission and distribution equipment.

Upon completion of this qualification, students can enter apprenticeships and can specialise in; domestic, commercial and industrial electrical systems, electrical instrument control, photovoltaic energy, renewable energy technical support, data communications, computers systems, appliances and entertainment, refrigeration, air-conditioning, fire and security systems or transport. The course involves both theory and practical skills and students will learn how to safely solve problems in electrical DC circuits, identify and select materials for Electrotechnology work activities, participate in environmentally sustainable work practices, and dismantle, assemble and fabricate Electrotechnology components.



CERTIFICATE II PLUMBING (PRE-APPRENTICESHIP) CPC20812 (RTO 41026)

This qualification is designed to provide a pathway into a career within the plumbing industry. It includes a broad range of plumbing related skills and competencies and ensures students are work ready.

Additional competencies for Year 12 students are available through Stackable VET and employment outcomes are predominantly achieved through an Australian Apprenticeship.

Gain the practical skills, knowledge and experience you need to work in the plumbing and services sector and be ready to take on a plumbing apprenticeship. You will learn about safe work practices, how to use plumbing tools, and all about plumbing pipes, fittings, and fixtures. This hands-on course also includes an introduction to oxy-acetylene welding and cutting and basic sheet metal practices.

This qualification is also the pre-requisite to the Certificate IV in Veterinary Nursing.

This completed qualification can count as a Year 12 subject in ATAR calculations.

This qualification reflects the role of group and gym fitness instructors. These fitness instructors may plan and deliver group exercise sessions and develop gym-based programs for individuals where the level of personalised instruction and ongoing client monitoring is limited. They work in predictable environments under general supervision. When instructing groups or interacting with clients, they use discretion and judgment to solve routine issues within the parameters of clearly defined organisational policies and procedures.
